Child Safety Requirements

As mentioned in previous newsletters, we will be sharing with you information about our Child Safe Standards in fortnightly newsletters.

This week, we are looking at Child Safe Standard Seven and Standard Eight.

Standard Seven focuses on ensuring that schools have complaints processes that are child-focused, culturally safe and accessible to everyone. To comply with this standard at St Peter's, we:

- have a complaints handling process focused on students and their safety needs
- take complaints and concerns seriously
- respond promptly and thoroughly
- identify and respond to all forms of child abuse
- report child abuse to relevant authorities, whether or not there is a legal obligation to report it.

St Peter's Complaints handling processes focuses on students and their safety needs. Our process enables us to handle all kinds of complaints and concerns. A complaint might reveal a bigger issue or prevent a situation from escalating.

We empower our students to raise low-level concerns as this improves the likelihood that they will feel comfortable making a disclosure or reporting abuse.

Standard 8 focuses on building child safety knowledge, skills and awareness in staff, volunteers and school governing authorities. St Peter's delivers training to new and existing staff and volunteers. The training is tailored to the needs of the school and the role the person performs.

By training all staff and volunteers, everyone has a shared understanding of what child safety means, the importance of child safety, what to look for, and what to do.

This provides our staff and volunteers with the knowledge and skills they need to create a schoolwide culture of child safety. Appropriate training and supervision helps keep staff and students safe and ensures St Peter's meets their child safety and occupational health and safety legal requirements.



COMPASS

St Peter's is excited to announce that we will be using 'Compass' from the beginning of Term 3 2024. This platform, which can be easily accessed through the app or your web browser, will be the **school's communication platform from July 15th, 2024.**

Compass will allow parents/carers to easily

- Access the school newsletter and notices
- Report an absence
- Access school reports
- Sign permission forms for school excursions and events
- Make fees/accounts payments
- View your child's first aid entries

<u>Seesaw will continue to be used to share your child's learning only. No school notices will be shared through this platform.</u>

On Wednesday a note was sent home with your login details so you can set up your account. Each child will receive a note however the log in details will be the same, only one account will need to be created per parent/carer. It is expected that all families register before the end of Term 2 (June 28th) so they are prepared to receive all school information through Compass from the beginning of Term 3.

Please see the office staff if you require any assistance with your account set up. Families requiring assistance with this process can access support on Monday 15th July. Support staff will be in the community lounge area during the parent teacher interviews.

Changes to Procedure for Reporting an Absence from Term 3

From Term 3, all absences should be reported via Compass.

Where possible, absences should be notified prior to the absence / lateness occurring.

- From the homepage, click on the blue shortcuts button from the bottom taskbar
- 2 Click on 'Submit Attendance Note'
 - > Select the reason
 - > Enter a brief description of the absence
 - → Select the start and finish time
 - → Click the 'Save' button

Religious Education

St Peter

Next week we will celebrate the feast of our patron saint, St Peter. The feast day of St Peter is shared with St Paul on June 29th.

Students in all year levels have participated in learning that have included some of the following understandings:

- Our school is named after Saint Peter
- Peter was a fisherman
- St Peter was one of Jesus' disciples
- St Peter was named Simon. Jesus changed his name to Peter.

 He is sometimes referred to as Simon Peter in Scripture.
- There are many stories about St Peter in The Bible
- Peter had great faith in Jesus
- Peter had flaws too, he was not perfect but he did his best to follow and show love to Jesus.
- Peter taught other people about Jesus
- Peter was the first Pope (leader of the Church)

At home you can ask your child to share some of their learning about St Peter or as a family see what new things you can find out together.

In the Gospel readings for the Solemnity of St Peter as St Paul, which we will hear at mass next week, Jesus asks;

"But what about you?" He asked. "Who do you say I am?"
Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

In this reading Simon Peter acknowledges Jesus as the Messiah, Saviour and Redeemer, Son of the living God.

Simon Peter goes on to spread the Good News and to build the foundation of the Catholic Church.

Wellbeing

Show Respect

One of our values is to show respect. We can show respect to others through our words and actions. Showing respect helps to build relationships and maintain a happy and safe school environment where everyone is valued and accepted.

St Peter's is a proud multicultural school. We have a diverse community which encompasses a range of cultural and religious backgrounds. We show respect by valuing and embracing our diversity.

As a community, it is our responsibility to inform our students that there is no place for racism in our school community and beyond. Working in partnership we can provide a happy and safe learning environment and equip our students with the skills to build and maintain happy, healthy relationships at school and in the wider community.

Having a conversation about racism can be challenging however there are resources available to support parents/carers. Raising Children has some information to support you to have a conversation with your child about racism.

We value your support in ensuring that St Peter's values the cultural and religious diversity of our community.

After School Supervision

It has been reported to the school that a number of students are waiting for family pick up outside the church on the corner of Wedge and Davison Street.

This pick up area is not supervised by our staff. It is a public space. We strongly encourage students to wait in the supervised areas.

Staff supervision afterschool is from 3.20pm - 3.35pm. The supervised areas are the Wedge Street gate near the Year 5/6 classrooms and the two gates on Coulstock Street.

The school has an excellent after school care program that can offer supervision outside these hours. We encourage you to consider this option for student after school supervision.

Discrimination, racism and bullying are not tolerated at St Peter's.

Mobile Phones and Smart Watches at School

At the beginning of each year students and families are asked to read over and sign a digital technologies user agreement. As a part of this, you are asked to share and agree to the **Mobile Phone and Smart**

Watches Policy.

Students are required to bring their mobile phones and smart watches to the office upon arrival in the morning (before going to our morning play areas). These can then be collected at the end of the day after the dismissal bell. These devices are not to be used at school.

Mobile Phone and Smartwatch Policy

Policy Statement

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that mobile phone and smartwatch usage is effectively managed at St Peter's Primary School. It outlines to the school community the requirements and expectations relating to student use of mobile phone and smart watches during school hours.

Definitions

<u>Mobile Phone</u>: a telephone with cellular (telecommunication) system that has the capability of performing one or more of the following actions; making calls, text messaging, accessing email, photography, video recording and voice recording.

<u>Smartwatch</u>: a wearable computing device that closely resembles a wristwatch and is capable of performing one or more of these following actions; making calls, text messaging, accessing emails, photography, video recording and voice recording.

Rationale

This policy outlines the use of mobile phones and smart watches on our school site.

The school discourages students from bringing mobile phones and smartwatches to school. These communication devices cause disruption in classrooms and the playground, and can be used inappropriately to access social media and take photos and recordings without permission. This can cause distress and breach the privacy of others.

St Peter's Primary School understands that students may need to carry a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

In the event a parent/carer needing to contact a student, he/she should telephone the School Administration Office on 9401 1157. If necessary, students can contact parents/carers from the school office telephone.

Expectations relating to student bringing mobile phone and smart watches to school

At St Peter's Primary School:

Students who choose to bring mobile phones and smartwatches to school, must have them switched off when entering the school grounds. Students must take any mobile phones and smart watches to the school administration office once they arrive at school. They will be placed in a tub and kept in the office. Devices can be collected from the office at the end of the school day.

Exemptions

Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met and approval is granted by the Principal. or a small number of students with particular health needs, an exception to the policy may also be granted. arents/Carers will need to provide a Medical Management Plan authorised by the treating medical/health ractitioner outlining the need to use a device.

Ion-compliance with this policy

Iny use of mobile phones and smart watches by a student, that is in breach of these rules, will ead to the confiscation of the device. In this instance, parents will be notified and confiscated evices will need to be collected from the school administration office by the student's parent/carer at the end of the lay.

olicies are reviewed regularly and may be subject to change at the school's discretion.

Year 2 Excursion

On Monday the 17th of June, the Year 2s spent the day at Sea Life Melbourne Aquarium.

As part of our Inquiry unit "Living Things Grow and Change" students dived deep into the underwater world to discover the life cycles and habitats of sharks, fish, turtles and even crocodiles! Primary School Nursing Program (PSNP)

On Monday 24th June the school nurse will be visiting the prep students. The PSNP is a free service offered to all children attending primary schools in Victoria. Primary school nurses visit schools throughout the year and provide children with:

- the opportunity to have a health assessment
- information and advice about healthy behaviours
- a link for children and families to community-based health and wellbeing services.

The PSNP is designed to identify children with potential health-related learning difficulties and to respond to parent/carer concerns and observations about their child's health and wellbeing. Where parents/carers have provided consent by completing the School Entrant Health Questionnaire a follow-up health assessment will be conducted by the school nurse.

Late Arrivals and Early Departures

Students who arrive late to or leave early from the school must also have 'approvals' logged by parents. Please note that these can only be recorded after the fact as they are "time stamped" by Compass. All students who arrive late to school must report to the office to ensure they are not marked as absent for the first session. Parents will need to sign their child and record the reason for the late arrival. Students leaving early must be signed out by a parent or carer that is listed as a student contact. If your child is being signed out by someone who is not authorised to do so, the parent / carer should contact the office in advance before the child can be picked up.
